***The Artist Showcase has a Special Exhibit this month challenging the artists to create works for a Jazz Theme to coincide with the Port Townsend Jazz Festival.***

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
## ***Artist of the Month*** **Linda Tilley**

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
### Arts to Elders Presents The Al Harris Trio


